

COVID Update

Last week our newsletter explained that Covid cases in Wokingham were still very high, and requested that parents continued to wear face masks during drop off and pick up time. Thank you to everyone who has continued to wear a mask. Earlier this week, I wrote to families and explained that we had reached contingency thresholds in school, which meant that we needed to take additional measures to try prevent further Covid infections. Unfortunately, we are still continuing to see high levels of infection across the school, and more worryingly, high levels of infection in the staff teams. Today we had 9 members of staff out of school with Covid related absence, which I am sure you will appreciate makes keeping to the daily routine very difficult. We have now reached a point where having only one or two more staff members fall ill will lead to us having to make the difficult decision to close a year group for a short time, as we will not be able to meet safety thresholds. Unfortunately, owing to the nature of Covid infections, we will not know this until the morning someone tests positive. I wish to assure you that we will, in all cases, do our very best to keep the year groups open and running, and only if we are unable to ensure the safety of the children, as a last resort will close the impacted year group until we have sufficient staff available to open. In the case of a closure, we will notify the affected year group by text immediately, and then follow up with a parentmail explaining the circumstances. We will aim to do this with as much notice as possible, as we realise that this will impact on many parents and their work.

Thank you to everyone who has continued to test their families regularly and who are working hard to keep our community safe- we really appreciate every effort.
