What miserable weather we have at the moment- hopefully we are in for better weather this weekend.

I would like to start this week's newsletter with a list of things to say 'thank you' for. Firstly, thank you to all the parents who were so patient with the teething troubles we had with our virtual parents' evening this week. I know the format and organisation were different from usual, but the majority of sessions went ahead without a hitch. Hopefully as it seemed to get easier with each day's sessions, we shouldn't have any trouble with the parents' evenings we will hold in November. Thank you also to every parent who sent their child into school to have a school dinner yesterday. We had 152 meals served, which is the highest amount we have had this year so far. It will really make a difference to the amount of money we have to take from our budget to pay for the school meals this year! Thank you also to all the wonderful parents who are wearing a mask when dropping off or collecting their children from school. And, thank you also to all those parents who are exiting the playground swiftly once they have dropped off or collected their children. We all really appreciate the effort you're making to keep us healthy, safe and open.

You may have noticed that we have been **opening the classroom doors a little earlier in the mornings**, this is in an effort to reduce the number of children and parents on the playgrounds and also to make it less congested on the playground and around the classroom doors. Hopefully having a 15 minute window in which to drop off your child in the morning will make it a little easier to keep socially distanced.

If you have a message to pass to your child's teacher, please can you write a little note which you hand over when your child goes into class, rather than chat with the teacher. Ordinarily, we encourage you to chat to your child's teacher, but at the moment, we are trying to reduce the contact between adults in school. You can also email or call the school to arrange a telephone call with your child's teacher if needed.

As part of the safety measures we have had to take in school, we are required to keep our windows open for ventilation in the classrooms, which means that some of the classes can be quite cold (particularly in Year 1 and EYFS). Please ensure that you send your child into school with a jumper (it doesn't have to be a school jumper) so that they can stay warm in class.

A few reminders, **firstly**, **parents need to fill in and submit their e-consent forms for their children's flu vaccinations as soon as possible**, and by Monday at the latest. We all know that preventing other winter flu viruses is especially important this year! Secondly, we will be having our **school photographs on 21**<sup>st</sup> **October**. Regrettably, we will not be able to arrange sibling photographs this year, unless both children are in the Infant School, as we cannot allow cross-bubble contamination.


A number of children are coming into school with **very large keyrings** (soft toys etc) attached to their bookbags. Aside from being so large that the children's trays can't close, they are also potential infection carriers. Keyrings are a good idea to help children quickly find their own bookbags, but please limit it to one small keyring (the Fab Brick keyrings that help fundraise for the PTA are just the right size) that is easily wipeable with a disinfectant wipe.
