Stem Cell Registry Information

At the school Christmas Fair this year, there will be a stall to sign up to the stem cell registry with the charity, DKMS.

Layla, is a little 4 year old girl, from Sonning, who has already suffered 2 bone marrow failures as the result of chemotherapy given to treat a brain tumour when she was 2 years old. She may one day in the future, need a stem cell transplant from a donor. That donor could be you.

Eligibility criteria, you must:

- be between 17-55 years old (You will stay on the register until you are 61)
- weigh more than 50kg and have a BMI of less than 40
- be in good health (health exclusion criteria is on the DKMS website)
- be permanently resident in the UK
- not already be on any other UK stem cell registry

If you meet the criteria above, please consider registering on the day, or online.

All it will take on the day is 5-10 minutes of your time. There is a form to complete and 3 cheek swabs to do. Once the swabs have been analysed by the DKMS labs, you will go on standby. If you are then found to be a matching donor, there are two donation methods: 90% of the time, the process is similar to giving blood, 10% of the time it is a surgical procedure under general anaesthetic.

There are around 2,000 people waiting for a stem cell transplant in the UK. One day you could be somebody's lifesaver and be able to give them a second chance of life. Do something incredible and join the stem cell registry.
